What should I already know?

- The names of toys I have at home
- What materials some toys are made from
- That things were different in the past (Year 2 to make links to houses and homes, Fire of London and Explorers)
- Recall toys they used to play with when they were younger

At the end of the unit, I will be able to:

- Sequence some objects in order of time, using words and phrases related to toys and the past
- Tell the difference between past and present in our own lives
- Listen to eye-witness accounts from grandparents,
- Begin to suggest why something might be different
- Identify and recount some details from the past from pictures and stories
- Find answers to simple questions about the past by using source material
- draw labelled diagrams and write about them to tell others about objects from the past.

Key information

How long have toys existed?	Toys have been around for thousands of years. The first toys were made from rocks, stone and string.
What are toys used for?	Toys can be lots of fun! You can play with them on your own, with a friend or with lots of people.
What materials are toys made from?	Toys have been made from paper, metal, plastic, wood and soft materials like cotton or wool.
How are modern toys different?	Lots of modern toys use electricity to work.










Recognise about mutual respect and how to acknowledge the feelings of others from the past. Learn how Victorian children played with their friends and cared for their toys.

Some differences between old and new toys		Victorian Toys	
<p>Old toys were often made of wood.</p>  <p>Modern (new) toys are often made of plastic.</p> 		<p>Children from rich Victorian families played with toys such as rocking horses, toys soldiers and dolls.</p> 	
<p>Old toys were mechanical or moved by hand.</p>  <p>Modern toys use batteries.</p> 		<p>Children from poor Victorian families played with toys such as wooden boats and peg dolls or bought cheap toys from the market.</p> 	
<p>Old toys were usually made by hand.</p>  <p>Modern (new) toys are usually made by machines.</p> 		<p>In many homes the only toy children were allowed to play with on Sundays was Noah's Ark because it was related to the bible.</p> 	
		<p>Victorian children enjoyed playing outside. They played games like football or hoop rolling.</p>
