Christening / Baptism


A christening is when a baby is welcomed into the Christian faith. The baby's parents and friends all go to a church service. Sometimes in a christening, the vicar will dip their hand in some oil. They will then move their hand in the shape of a cross over the baby's head. The vicar will hold the baby's head over the font and then sprinkle the baby with water. The vicar will say the words: 'I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.' During the christening, special prayers are said for the baby. Sometimes at a christening, a special candle is lit. The vicar will say to the baby 'Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God'. After the christening, family and friends might have a special meal or a party. It is a very happy time.



Aqiqah

When a Muslim baby is born, they are welcomed into Islam in a special way. Seven days after a Muslim baby is born, a special ceremony called Aqiqah will take place. This special ceremony is the time when the baby is welcomed into the Muslim faith. The parents invite family and friends to come and meet the new baby. At the ceremony, the parents and guests give thanks to Allah for the new baby. Guests bring gifts and the baby is given a taste of something sweet like honey or date juice. This is to reflect the sweetness of Allah's words in The Qur'an. At the Aqiqah ceremony, the baby's family and friends enjoy a special meal together.

During the Aqiqah ceremony, the new baby will have his or her head shaved. This symbolises the baby starting its life afresh in Allah's presence. The hair that has been cut off is weighed and this weight is given in gold or silver to charity. Prayers are said for the baby and the baby's name will be revealed to the guests. Once a baby has been purified by the Aqiqah ceremony, they should grow up to respect the Five Pillars of Islam and be faithful to Allah.

Belong	To belong is to be in a place or a group where you feel safe, secure and valued.
Identity	A person's identity is the qualities, likes and dislikes that make them who they are.
Religion	A system of faith or worship linked to one or many gods.
Role	A role is a part that a person can play. In a family, this might be the position that you hold e.g. son, daughter, sister or brother.
Community	A community is a group of people living or working together or who have shared interests.
Symbol	A symbol is something that stands for something else. An object with an underlying meaning.
Shabbat	The Jewish day of rest, taking place each Friday evening until Saturday evening.
Aqiqah	The Muslim ceremony that takes place to welcome a new baby into the Islamic community.
