We have had a number of queries about uniform. Our <u>uniform policy</u> should contain answers to most of these but please do speak to staff if you are unsure. The policy is clear that earrings must be removed for PE (including swimming) and for forest school. It suggests that any piercing is done at the very start of the summer so they are ready for removal after 6 weeks. Please avoid any piercing until then as children will need to sit out for these lessons until earrings can be removed.

Attendance

It was great to see a good level of attendance in our first week back. This is something that it is vital we continue to work on as we are still working our way back to the prepandemic levels nationally and here at Manor. As the children mix back together having been apart for the summer they are bound to pick up minor infections from each other. It can sometimes be difficult for parents to judge when to keep children off and when to keep sending them. The link below should hopefully help with that decision making. Safeguarding

Keeping the children safe is always our first priority. Owls Swimming

This term we have booked swimming for Year 3 and Year 4 at Kingsbury. This is a much better deal than we had last year and we have booked a Fierté minibus to transport the children with our staff, who have passed their minibus assessment medical. and driving. Because we only have one minibus available at that time we are splitting the class and doing Year 4 swimming in the first half term then Year 3 after. This means they will get much more time actually in the water rather than travelling or changing etc and there will be 2 qualified swimming teachers for the 12 children so lots of close attention to help them make progress. Not having to pay the huge costs of a coach make such a difference!
