Fire Drill

If you live in the village you may occasionally hear our fire alarm sounding for about 5 minutes. We make sure we have a termly practice so that everyone knows what they are doing in cases of emergency. We vary the times of day (e.g. lunchtime, PE days etc.) and days of the week then review how the drills have gone making sure fire doors close properly and registers are taken efficiently etc. We usually have an empty building within about 30 seconds and registers completed within 2 minutes at a safe muster point away from the building. Teacher Training Placements

We have skilled very and experienced teachers here at Manor and Birmingham City University have found us to be a valued 'Principal Partner' supporting their teacher training programme. We have two placements in this autumn term with one associate teacher having a placement in Owls and one in Penguins. In offering a placement at our school we get a number of advantages such as: having an extra professional adult in the classroom to support children; new ideas and enthusiasm; our teachers need to be on their game to model the best practice and it makes them reflect on their own performance; time for our staff to focus on supporting children that need a boost or developing their own subject leadership while the associate teacher is leading a lesson. There is of course extra work that comes with it for our mentor teachers but they are keen to give something back and help develop the next generation of teachers and it adds an extra vibrancy to our provision.

Maths	Year 3 will complete their addition and subtraction block by learning the column method for up to 3 digit numbers Year 4 will learn what the area of a shape is and compare areas of shapes.

Reading	Reading extracts from novels set in WW2 and independently applying comprehension skills to answer test style questions.				
Writing	Continuing with our retell of the Rose Blanche story with a focus on punctuation (brackets, commas, colons), precise verbs, conjunctions and figurative language (similes, alliteration, pathetic fallacy)				
Maths	Multiplication and Division - with a focus on: factors, multiples, prime numbers, mental calculations, multiplying numbers up to 4 digits X 2, (long multiplication for year 6) and dividing numbers up to 4 digits by 2 digits.

Owls have been working hard on their aboriginal Dreamtime artwork.












Owls have also created a homemade compass by putting a magnet in a small bowl, then floating that bowl in a larger bowl of water, as in this picture.
Why not try this at home?




