Reading	Children will be reading and appreciating a range of poetry. They will explore the themes, rhyming patterns and voice tones needed for reading poetry effectively.				
Writing	Children have worked hard at learning an autumn poem off by heart. In the next two weeks they will be focussing on a range of poetry including Haiku's, Cinquain and acrostic poems. children will understand the building blocks of these types of poetry and create their own harvest/autumn linked poems in each of the styles named above.				
Maths	Children will learn the fundamentals of multiplication so they understand what it means to multiply numbers together. They will also spend time practising and looking at shortcuts for key times tables.

Reading	We will be using a technique called 'Reader's Theatre' to practise reading fluency. Mrs Armstrong will be changing our information sheet about the Battle of Britian into a play script so we can practise our fluency and understanding of a text.				
Writing	This week will be our BIG WRITE week where we will be using all of our wonderful ideas to write our own story set in England or Germany during the war.				
Maths	Multiplication is our focus for the week before half term - we will be multiplying 2 digits by 2 digits, 3 digits by 2 digits and 4 digits by 2 digits. After half term we will move on to division. Keep practising those times tables -they will help massively with our multiplication and division lessons.				

Playtime Snacks

Some parents have been asking for some clarification on our policy for snacks at playtime. This is always difficult as we need to have simple rules that everyone can follow despite nutrition and food being a complex issue. Our basic message that we teach the children is about a balanced diet with 'sugary' and 'fatty' foods being nice for an occasional treat. We ask that these treats are mostly kept for home.

Judging what is 'healthy' is an impossible job for staff and most parents who are not nutritionists! Some things are easy to judge such as sweets and chocolate bars and staff will feel confident to challenge these, but cereal bars with chocolate criteria of being mobile phone friendly.

You said...You felt most supported in helping your children by visiting their classrooms in workshops.

We did...We have a maths workshop after half term that will be based in classes working on areas that could be followed up at home with your child. We have more workshops planned through the year with less input in the hall than previously and more time in classes.

You said...children have settled well and transition was good but one parent suggested teachers send a letter/message right at the start of the year to clarify PE days, homework etc.

We did...This is booked in for next year as part of INSET Day before school starts. Sometimes there are changes at the start of the year with our providers such as sports coaches and swimming so it takes a week or two for the timetable to settle down but we will certainly endeavour to keep you better informed of this. You said... Can we have the app back?

We did... We have already requested this be set up on our new website so should be available soon. We will let you know as soon as possible.

You said...One parent said Nursery children who were full time shouldn't have a staggered start in Reception.

We did... Staff have discussed this previously and reduced the stagger to 2 days that we have now. This allows the teacher to visit new starters in Ducklings on those two afternoons which means children have met the

chips etc. are more difficult. We clearly can't be reading the packaging on each item!

The kitchen sell wholemeal toast with non-dairy spread and pancakes that don't have any extra topping or sugar. There are fresh vegetables and fruit available for free each day.

So... to summarise, please could we ask parents to consider sending snacks that are what they would consider to be 'healthy' for their child. Some examples might be cereal bars, fresh or dried fruit, bakes without extra sugary toppings or fillings, flap jack, fresh vegetables like carrot or pepper, bread sticks, popcorn...

Please don't send:

- anything containing nuts
- anything with chocolate spread as they look the same as Nutella
- sweets
- chocolate

Portions should be 'snack sized' rather than e.g. full sandwiches or 'family sized' sharing packs. Children are not allowed to share their snacks with others.

If you are unsure, please do feel free to ask and we will try and communicate any concerns we may have to you. Together we can hopefully help our children to form some good habits and develop a healthy relationship with food.


Thursday this week was 'National Values Day'. Following assembly, children were challenged to choose a value to work on and share a selfie from home or school.
