Parent Workshops

We have some new parent workshops in the calendar for next term. On Thursday 11th Mr Culff has invited to follow this scheme that is based on the latest research and is written by subject specialists. We expect it to support our teachers in their planning reducing their workload while raising the quality of the delivery and the pathway of learning through subjects like history, geography, art, DT, science, French and RE.

Great Fire of Drayton Bassett

Swans class have been studying the Great Fire of London this term and have learned all about how it started, what the houses were like and how this helped it to spread, as well as how they pulled houses down to create breaks that stopped it spreading. The children and parents made their own houses at home together and brought them in to school. The children were consulted and those who agreed had their houses lined up like a Tudor street on the field and Mr Culff set the end house on fire. The children watched from a safe distance as the fire spread from house to house. Mr Culff then removed a house to create a gap and the fire wasn't able to jump across so the other houses were saved....until they were also set alight! Of course, there was an element of fire safety learning planned in too. If you saw smoke coming from the school field and heard choruses of 'London's Burning' echoing around the village, now you know why! Thank you to parents for creating the houses with the children and to Mr Culff and Mrs Mason for making such memorable but safely planned activity.




