### **Holiday in Term Time**

Just a polite reminder that we are not allowed to authorise holiday in term time (other than in truly exceptional circumstances) and all holidays of a day or more will result in a penalty notice being issued. As the majority of our families do, please try to keep holidays to the 13 weeks of school holiday each year. Our average attendance is slowly creeping up to 95.3% currently. This is good, but still below the 97% we got nearly every year before Covid. Thank you for your support in this.

#### Fierté Minibuses

The cost of coach travel has become very expensive in recent months and has made educational visits costly. We had hoped to be able to use the Fierté minibuses this year to help bring down costs but that has meant relying on staff from other schools to drive us and they have not been available. We have several staff who are keen to be able to drive for us but, quite rightly, there is a strict medical and testing procedure in Staffordshire to qualify. There are huge backlogs in the system meaning waiting many months for appointments. Several staff are now getting these appointments through now so we hope to have drivers qualified at some point over the summer
