Scene 1 – A Christmas Quarrel

The main action takes place on the central stage. The CHORUS (made up of all the children not currently on stage) are seated evenly on the left and right of the stage, or directly in front of the stage on a lower level. The CHORUS join in with all songs and reactions.

The NARRATORS walk on and stand in front of the main stage to introduce the play.

LIGHTS UP.

NARRATOR 1: Welcome to our Christmas play, we're all so glad you came.
We have a funny tale to tell, the elves must take the blame.

NARRATOR 2: Each year they make their Christmas plans, for toys and gifts galore,
To make each Christmas special, even better than before.

NARRATOR 3: But this year they could not agree on what makes Christmas great.
They argued and they bickered, and they got in quite a state!

NARRATOR 4: As time was ticking on, they knew an answer must exist.
They had to find a way to settle what would top the list.

NARRATOR 1: So, let's start at the beginning...

NARRATOR 2: To show you how they solved...

NARRATOR 3: Their foolish Christmas quarrel...

NARRATOR 4: And the fun that this involved!

NARRATORS exit / join CHORUS.

BACKDROP *The Elves' Toy Workshop.*

BOSSY, STYLISH, CHEEKY, GRUMPY, CLEVER and any other non-speaking ELVES enter and gather on stage holding images of different Advent calendar designs.

An easel or whiteboard is brought on by one of the ELVES to display the images clearly to the audience. BOSSY is carrying a clipboard and pen for the meeting.

- BOSSY ELF:** (*bossily*) Welcome to our first Elf Committee meeting. As you know, our first job is to choose the best Christmas picture for our new Advent calendar. I've decided it should be a Christmas tree – agree?
- STYLISH ELF:** (*dramatically*) No, no, no! This year darling, I think we should be more stylish and have a beautiful wreath with berries and mistletoe and glitter – something glamorous!
- CHEEKY ELF:** BORING! (*excitedly*) I think we should have something funny like a Santa breakdancing (*performs a comical dance*) or Rudolph in swimming trunks! (*pretends to be surfing*)
- CLEVER ELF:** (*calmly*) Interesting suggestions, but I really think it should be something about the history of Christmas. Something traditional... like a Nativity scene?
- GRUMPY ELF:** (*grumpily*) Well, don't ask me. You can put a lump of coal on it for all I care. I just need to eat more candy canes soon... I'm having a serious sugar crash here!
- BOSSY ELF:** (*angrily*) You SHOULD care! These are very important decisions! How will we create Christmas spirit if our calendar has pictures of coal or Rudolph's bottom on it?
- CHEEKY ELF:** Hey, what's wrong with Rudolph's bottom?
- STYLISH ELF:** (*interrupting*) It's not designer darling!
- CLEVER ELF:** Come on now, let's not argue...
- GRUMPY ELF:** (*even more grumpily*) Yes, you're wasting my candy cane eating time!
- STYLISH ELF:** (*to BOSSY*) Well, this is a disaster sweetie... like wearing spots with stripes! There MUST be a better way to decide.

The ELVES continue to argue silently (*mimed*) as intro music for **A Christmas Quarrel (Track 1)** starts. Any other ELVES needed from the CHORUS now stand and gather in the relevant groups, with the five main ELVES (the staging will depend on how you decide to split the lines of the song).

Song 1: A Christmas Quarrel

At the end of the song, CHORUS sit down as the ELVES walk back to the easel and continue to argue loudly, getting more animated about their own ideas and putting the other ideas down. BOSSY gets fed up, stands at the front and yells long and loud.

BOSSY ELF: (shouting) STOP!!!

Everyone freezes mid action - a great opportunity to have a comedy freeze frame, e.g. CHEEKY freezes with his tongue stuck out to STYLISH.

If Santa could see this – his beard would fall off in shock! We have to find a way to decide this now!

Everyone slowly comes out of the freeze frame looking embarrassed.

CLEVER ELF: Ok, why don't we each explain why we think our idea is best and then we can all vote?

STYLISH ELF: That seems fair...

CHEEKY ELF: Brilliant, my idea will DEFINITELY win!

GRUMPY ELF: If it means this meeting finishes sooner... I'm in.

BOSSY ELF: (slightly irritated) Thank you. I was just about to suggest that myself! Everyone choose your favourite thing about Christmas and we'll begin. You might as well start (points at CLEVER)... it was your idea after all.

CLEVER ELF: Ok, well I'd like something very traditional... so I choose (CLEVER holds up a picture of a burning Yule log) a wintry Yule log!

ELVES exit.

Scene 2 – The Yule Festival

NARRATORS enter / stand to introduce the next scene.

NARRATOR 1: And so the elves took turns, to show off their design.
Beginning with a Yule log, but not the chocolate kind!

CHORUS: *(in a sad tone)* OH!

NARRATOR 2: Instead, a decorated log that burns for twelve whole days,
To celebrate the sun's return by keeping it ablaze.

NARRATOR 3: A time to party, eat and drink, with bottomless refills.

CHORUS: *(raise their hands and shout)* CHEERS!

NARRATOR 3: With mistletoe hung everywhere, to practise kissing skills.

CHORUS: *(disgusted)* YUK!

NARRATOR 4: So, back we go to Northern Europe for the feast of Yule,
You'll recognise some customs here, we think that's really cool!

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP A Nordic House / Yule Festival.

The intro music for **Yule Log Burning (Track 2)** begins, CHORUS stand (could all gather around a large Yule log).

Song 2: Yule Log Burning

At the end of the song CHORUS exit / sit down.

Scene 3 – Bangs of Expectation

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: Not all elves agreed this ancient festival was best,
Cheeky Elf thought his idea would surely beat the rest.

NARRATOR 2: So is the Christmas cracker going to be the one that wins?
Let's take a trip to London now, to see how this begins.

NARRATOR 3: The year is 1861 - for those who like details.
A baker named Tom Smith was wondering how to boost his sales.

NARRATOR 4: One night, while sitting by his fire and staring at the flames.
An idea came to mind, or so the legend claims!

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP A Victorian Living Room.

*The CHORUS stand ready to perform **Bangs of Expectation (Track 3)**. They could be wearing paper hats from a Christmas cracker or create their own Christmas cracker hats.*

Song 3: Bangs Of Expectation

CHORUS exit / sit down.

Scene 4 – We Decorate the Christmas Tree

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: Their quarrel seemed quite endless, as the elves could not agree.
The next idea in question was the mighty Christmas tree.

NARRATOR 2: Now, decorating evergreens is quite an old tradition.
In fact you'll find that trimming trees is now a competition.

NARRATOR 3: The Romans trimmed their temples, for the feast of Saturnalia.
Victorians lit their candles, a health and safety failure!

NARRATOR 4: From tinsel, angels, bells and berries, even lumps of cheese.
(as an aside to the other NARRATORS) It's true, check Pinterest!
It's clear to see how much we love to decorate our trees.

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP A Modern Classroom.

*CHILDREN enter with a Christmas tree to decorate in the centre of the stage. The CHORUS stand, ready to perform **We Decorate Our Christmas Tree (Track 4)**.*

Song 4: We Decorate Our Christmas Tree

CHILDREN exit and the CHORUS sit.

Scene 5 – Nifty Nativity

This scene should be a fast-paced comical introduction with brief interactions between the NARRATORS, MARY, JOSEPH, ANGEL, DONKEY and the INNKEEPER.

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: The next idea the elves discussed is known to you and me.

NARRATOR 2: A famous Christmas story, yes you guessed... Nativity!

NARRATOR 3: Where an Angel said to Mary...

The NARRATORS pause as if waiting for something. They look to the main stage as the ANGEL GABRIEL and MARY run to centre stage frantically from opposite sides as if late for their cue.

ANGEL GABRIEL: *(shouting and pointing at MARY)* 'You'll bear the Son of God!'

MARY throws her hands to her face and gasps in shock. The NARRATORS continue.

NARRATOR 4: So Mary, Joseph and a donkey to Bethlehem did plod!

Again, the NARRATORS pause and look to the stage where JOSEPH and the DONKEY run on stage quickly and join MARY and the ANGEL GABRIEL onstage, looking a little confused.

NARRATOR 1: With no room at the inn, they had a stable for the night.

The INNKEEPER is either pushed or stumbles on stage reluctantly and holds up a sign which says, 'Fully Booked'.

INNKEEPER: *(pointing at his sign)* Booked up until March!

NARRATOR 2: Where Mary had a little boy, which gave the cows a fright!

A baby doll is pushed across the stage from offstage and caught by MARY, while we hear the sound of a cow mooing in distress!

MARY: Ah, I think I'll call him 'Insert Name'.

JOSEPH: *(Joseph shakes his head)* He doesn't look like a 'Insert Name' to me.

NARRATOR 3: The birth of baby JESUS (Not 'Insert Name'), meant visitors all night long.

NARRATOR 4: In fact, let's tell the rest of this by singing you a song.

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP *The Nativity Scene.*

*The intro music to **The First Noel (Track 5)** begins as the CHORUS stand. The CHOIR OF ANGELS enter and the STAR, SHEPHERD, WISE MEN and any other characters chosen, now prepare for their entrance on the appropriate line of the song to create a final Nativity tableau.*

Song 5: The First Noel

ALL CHARACTERS involved in the Nativity scene exit and CHORUS sit.

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: And now we travel back in time, to Christmas Eve last year. Where elves are busy sorting gifts and spreading Christmas cheer.

Scene 6 – Santa’s Sleigh

NARRATOR 2: With stockings hung in every house for presents large and small.
In fact, the biggest stocking hung was 50 metres tall!
(all other NARRATORS look amazed and whisper, “WOW!”)

NARRATOR 3: While Romans gave small gifts, to show how much they loved their friends.
Victorians gave gifts galore, they really loved to spend!

NARRATOR 4: But the most important gift-giver, from England to Atlanta.
Is ‘Father Christmas’, ‘Père Noël’, also known as ‘Santa’.

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP Santa’s Sleigh.

*The intro music to **Wrap and Stack (Track 6)** starts as the ELVES line up with their boxes ready for the assembly line with the sack held by SANTA ready to be filled with presents.*

Song 6: Wrap And Stack

At the end of the song, all gifts are in the sack and ready to go.

SANTA and the ELVES exit and CHORUS sit down.

Scene 7 – In Our House at Christmas

This scene contains an editable song that can be adapted by the individual school to create a fun personalised scene for the children and families. The sillier the better for a more comical routine!

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: And so the task continued, with so many different views.
A Christmas Turkey! Snowflakes! How would they ever choose?

NARRATOR 2: We haven't even mentioned all the latest Christmas trends,
Christmas Elf, Christmas jumpers, the list just never ends!

NARRATOR 3: It's true that many families have unique and different ways,
Of counting down and celebrating their special Christmas Days.

NARRATOR 4: So now let's take a little peek, and this will make you smile.
Let's see how (*ENTER SCHOOL NAME*) likes to celebrate in style.

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP A Modern Christmas Living Room.

*CHORUS and the CHILDREN involved in the staging of this song stand and move into place with the relevant props and [Audience Word Cards](#) as the intro to **In Our House at Christmas (Track 7)** plays. The audience is encouraged to sing along.*

Song 7: In Our House at Christmas

CHILDREN exit and CHORUS sit down.

Scene 8 – A Christmas Party

NARRATORS enter / stand.

NARRATOR 1: And now we reach our final scene, who has won the vote?
Have the elves agreed at last? Who'll be the one to gloat?

NARRATOR 2: From crackers, logs, trees and gifts - we knew this would be hard.
To pick out just one winner... which ideas did they discard?

NARRATOR 3: Now as our play comes to an end, we hope you had a blast!
Our Christmas quarrel is resolved...

CHORUS MEMBER: *(stands and shouts)* Finally... at last!

NARRATOR 4: So let us see the end result and head back to our elves.
Fingers crossed, the deed is done, so we can enjoy ourselves!

NARRATORS exit / sit with CHORUS.

BACKDROP The Elves Toy Workshop.

BOSSY, CLEVER, STYLISH, GRUMPY AND CHEEKY ELF (and any additional ELVES cast in this scene) return to centre stage with their easel and clipboard. They appear to still be arguing.

BOSSY: *(checking the list on the clipboard)* Well that narrows it down to; a Christmas cracker, a Christmas tree, an angel, a Yule log, the Nativity, a Christmas present, Santa's Sleigh...oh, we still haven't decided on Rudolph's bottom!

GRUMPY: *(angrily)* So basically we still don't know? What a waste of my time! I might as well have spent today mucking out the reindeer!

GRUMPY sits down in a mood.

CLEVER: I disagree, I've really enjoyed listening to everyone's ideas.

STYLISH: Me too, I like them all... as long as we have some *(exaggerates this word)* 'Cartier' diamonds on it darling. We need to think designer!

CHEEKY: We could stick diamonds on Rudolph's bum – so it shines like his nose!
(laughs and wiggles bottom towards STYLISH who is not impressed and turns away in disgust)

BOSSY: *(frustrated)* Not helpful! Why can't we just agree on one?

The ELVES all gather around the easel again and continue checking and debating the pictures. SANTA enters in his usual jolly mood.

SANTA: *(smiling)* HO! HO! HO! How is my 'Calendar Committee' getting on?

CHEEKY: *(shaking head)* We still can't decide Santa – we've been trying for hours! Perhaps you should have the final vote.

SANTA thinks about this and takes the clipboard from BOSSY. He looks through the list.

SANTA: Well, I can see why it would be hard... these are ALL a special part of Christmas. *(thinking for a moment)* But do you know what I like most about Christmas?

ALL ELVES: *(together)* What Santa?

SANTA: *(laughing)* YOU! I love working with all of my Elves and Mrs Claus and the Reindeer... and even my lazy brother Fred! The best thing about Christmas is spending time with all of YOU!

CLEVER: *(jumps up excitedly)* You're right! *(picks up the picture of a present and holds it up)* Christmas would be no fun without someone to give a present to...

STYLISH: *(picks up a cracker and offers it to GRUMPY)* Or someone to pull a cracker with...

They pull the cracker together and CHEEKY wins the prize.

GRUMPY: Or someone to argue with! *(GRUMPY snatches the prize back from CHEEKY)*

BOSSY: *(confused)* So... the picture we really need on our Christmas calendar is us?

SANTA: Exactly! A friends and family photo! In fact, let's get everyone together and take one right now! Problem solved!

All the ELVES mutter happily and nod in agreement with excitement as they gather and follow SANTA into position for the song.

*As the intro music to **The Best Design (Track 8)** starts the CHORUS stand and all other remaining CAST MEMBERS join the ELVES and SANTA on stage for the finale.*

BACKDROP A Christmas Party.

Song 8: The Best Design

At the end of the song, the WHOLE CAST pose as if posing for a group photograph for the calendar.

ALL: *(shouting)* CHEESE!

LIGHTS DOWN.
