



Attendance

As mentioned previously, school attendance since Covid has still not fully recovered and the government are raising the expectations on schools and parents to improve this. Here at Manor we have always had above national levels of attendance but we are still below the levels we had before Covid. In nearly all cases absence at Manor is due to genuine medical reasons but we do have some holiday in term time and some persistent absence and lateness from some.

Governors recently adopted the Fierté attendance policy which is based on the latest government expectations. This has a strict set of protocols that we must follow including sending letters, contacting parents of children with poor attendance and arranging meetings. In the most part there are good reasons for the absences and we will be simply informing you of the level of attendance and offering support to help improve it together. After all, we all want the same thing... A good education for our children.
